With the support of Maxlite, Habitat for humanity have been able to build efficient and bright homes for the vulnerable that use far less energy than traditional homes so they will be cheaper to maintain while also kinder to the environment

What Impact has this case study example achieved?	This partnership began in 2013 with a 2.5 million dollar donation for the construction of sustainable homes for the less fortunate and a further donation of the lighting needed for these homes. That level of investment has had a huge impact on dozens of people's lives. The partnership also included Maxlite light bulbs being made available at over 200 habitat for humanity RE-stores which emphasise reuse and sustainability, this means this efficient technology is available to more people.
