Step-by-step instructions	Help your environment by using the 5 R's in your daily life! In this activity, we will be learning how to know what is to refuse, reduce, reuse, recycle and rot. Follow these steps to get started: 1. Go through your homeware and ask these questions when you are unsure of which approach to take: Refuse: Ask yourself - is this item essential in my life? Reduce: Ask yourself - where am I going today? Is there anything I can bring with me such as shopping bags or my own coffee cup I can take? Reuse: Ask yourself - Can I make use of this item for another purpose, or can someone else? Recycle: Ask yourself - Have I considered all of the above before putting this item into the recycling waste? Rot: Ask yourself - Is this item not 'clean' enough to be recycled first? 2.
